

TRIBE SLAMS TEACHERS, 13-2

STATESBORO, Ga.—Florida State's baseball Seminoles took a big step towards a possible District III NCAA play-off bid by slamming Georgia Teachers College here today, 13-2.

The Seminoles were still wearing the hitting togs they have had on for the past three games, slapping two GTC pitchers for 16 safeties.

Center fielder Owen McCarron led the Seminoles with three hits in five trips, but the clincher was attached in the seventh inning when shortstop Dick Howser poled a grand slam homer to put Danny Litwhiler's crew out of reach.

The Teachers held a one run advantage going into the sixth inning, but Seminole catcher John Sheppard picked one of starter John Hall's choice ones and whipped it over the left field wall with one mate aboard to put the Tribe in front.

TWO-HITTER

Seminole fire-baller Jerry Boxer held the Teachers to two hits.

Boxer struck out 14 batters in the nine inning stretch, but also experienced a little wildness, walking 10 batters.

Lefty John Bristol was to get the call today in the second and

final game against GTC. The Tribe moves to Auburn tomorrow for games with the Plainsmen Monday and Tuesday. Earlier in the season, Florida State nipped Auburn twice in Tallahassee.
