

The Florida State baseball team last Monday split a doubleheader with the Miami Hurricanes winning the first game 15-3 and losing the nightcap 2-1.

In the first game at Miami the Tribe banged out 17 hits. Tom Garcia started for the Seminoles but was relieved by Rudy Egle in the seventh. Garcia helped his cause by rapping a home run with one man on. Carlee Hendrix and Gerald Philip had three hits apiece and Owen McCarron had four RBI's by way of a single and triple for PSU.

In the second game, which was called in the eighth on account of darkness, the Hurricanes got only three hits but made them all count. Frank Slusser started on the mound but needed help from Fred Kenney in the seventh.

Miami got its first run on a

sacrifice fly by Pete Pergamo and its other run on a homer by Ed Contreras.

After the doubleheader the Tribe's record stood at 18-6 and their FIBC record was 6-2.

MIAMI (AP) — Steady five-hit pitching by H. C. Hearn enabled the University of Miami Hurricanes to salvage the second game of a doubleheader from Florida State University yesterday, 2-1, after the visiting Seminoles had walloped the Hurricanes, 15-3, in the first game.

Florida State hammered 17 hits in the first game, including a home run by pitcher Tom Garcia with Dick Howser on base. Carlee Hendrix and Gerald Philip each had three hits and Owen McCarron drove in four runs with a single and a triple.

In the second game Miami got only three hits, one run coming on Pete Pergamo's sacrifice fly and the other on Ed Contreras' home run.

Florida State moves up to Winter Park to meet Rollins College today and tomorrow in the Seminoles' final regular-season games.
