FSU Blanks Rollins

The Florida State University Seminoles own a firm grip on the top spot in the Florida Intercollegiate Baseball Conference following yesterday's 5-0 triumph over the Rollins Tars at Harper-Shepherd Field.

Jerry Boxer, a 6-2 redhcad from Brooklyn, limited the Tars to one hit, a game-opening single by Elmer Lott, and he sent 12 Tars back to the bench via the strikeout route.

THE CONTEST, scheduled as the first half of a twin bill, took four hours and 10 minutes to complete. A two-hour, one-minute delay in the sixth inning was due to a downpour. After the rain stopped, it took an hour to get the ground in playable condition.

.Umpires George Saib and Henry Smith called off the second game when the first tilt ended at 5:35 p.m.

FSU's record in the league now is 7-2 and the Seminoles finished loop competition yesterday. Rollins league standings read 5-3 and the Tars have three games to go.

The visitors jumped to a two-tun lead in the first inning on a walk to Owen McCarron and singles by Carl Hendrix and Dick Howser.

THE SEMINOLES added a pair in the third on McCarron's double. Hendrix' walk and Howser's single. The final marker came in the seventh on an error, a sacrifice and Howser's third safety of the game.
