Florida State University firmly established as the class of the NCAA's District 2, was ready today to move on to Omaha, Neb., and the College World Series.

The Seminoles will meet Penn State in the first game of the World Series Sunday at 2 p.m. The District 2 baseball title here last night with a sweeping 4-1 victory over Duke, Atlantic Coast Conference champion.
