

Gerald Philp's second grand-slam homer in as many nights helped propel Florida State to a 14-7 baseball victory over West Virginia at Centennial Field last night.

The victory put the Seminoles out front in their annual invitational tournament on a 2-0 record.

WIN PAIR

Earlier in the day the Seminoles collared Notre Dame, 5-2. Notre Dame then decisioned Wisconsin, 11-8, in a second afternoon fracas.

Philp's big blow last night came in the sixth inning with the Seminoles behind at the time, 5-3. The smash, into the leftfield bleachers, put the Tribe in front to stay.

On Friday night the senior left

fielder from Royal Oak, Mich., hit a 4-run homer in a 12-4 "exhibition" victory over Wisconsin. That one was an inside-the-park job.

Yesterday's neatest game turned out to be the Notre Dame-FSU clash, a battle between defending champs of the NCAA's District 4 and District 3. Seminole right-hander Frank Slusser fanned 11 and pitched out of two late-inning jams for the victory.

The Notre Dame loser was Chuck Symeon, victim of two unearned runs in early innings. Centerfielder Gene Duffy belted a triple and home run to give Slusser the most trouble.

Notre Dame's Frank Carpin spaced out 10 Wisconsin hits to gain the decision over the Badgers. The Irish exploded for six runs in the eighth inning to sew it up with Bob Senecal's towering home run the big blow.

Wisconsin leftfielder Ron Nie-

man continued his heavy hitting with a home run, his second along with a pair of triples in two days.

GRAND SLAM

West Virginia's Bucky Bolyard was working on a three-hitter when Philp's grand slam triggered a five-run Seminole uprising last night. Before it was over, FSU paraded six runs across in the ninth inning.

Fred Kenney, who took over from starter Tommy Garcia in the fifth, picked up his first victory of the season with a two-hit relief job over the last five innings.

Centerfielder Owen McCarron banged three hits in FSU's 10-hit attack on three Mountaineer pitchers.

The day's action left Notre Dame and Wisconsin in a second-place tournament deadlock with 1-1 records. West Virginia is 0-2.

Notre Dames goes against West Virginia at Seminole Field Monday afternoon, with FSU meeting Wisconsin at Centennial Field Monday night. The tournament runs through Thursday.
