

Their third straight invitational baseball tournament title tucked away, Florida State's Seminoles get down to some more serious business this afternoon in the opening of a two-game series with Florida at Gainesville.

FSU lefthander Jack Bristol and Florida's Donnie McCreary, a Tallahassee sandlot product, were to handle the first-game pitching duties.

Seminole righthander Tommy Garcia and Gator sophomore Ray Oestricher have been named to pitch the series finale tomorrow afternoon.

After last night's 3-1 victory over Wisconsin at Centennial Field, Danny Litwhiller's team will carry a six-game winning streak into the Florida series. Florida, leader in the Eastern Division of the Southeastern Conference with a perfect 6-0 standing, has won eight of 10 games this season.
