AUBURN, Ala. — Florida State's rebounding Seminoles humbled a previously-unbeaten Auburn pitcher for the second day in a row, backing up effective pitching by lefthander Jack Bristol for a 4-2 triumph here yesterday.

It was Florida State's 10th triumph this season and completed a two-game sweep from the Plainsmen. Frank Slusser set Auburn down on five hits in a 5-1 Seminole victory Friday.

SOPHOMORE HURLERS

Sophomore Red Roberts was tagged for the first-game loss and another first-year varsity pitcher, Alan Koch, was the victim yesterday. The Auburn sophomores had a combined record of nine victories and no defeats before Danny Litwhiler's club pulled into town.

The double sweep was sweet revenge for State, which lost two heartbreaking games to Auburn in Tallahassee a month ago.

Bristol, FSU's hard-kick hurler this spring, was on the beam yesterday spacing out eight Auburn hits. He was touched for only one run in posting his third against two losses.

Third baseman Dale Koch sparked a 10-hit Seminole attack on Alan Koch (the two are no relation), driving in half the Seminole runs. Rightfielder Mike Copps on a recent hitting binge, came through with a double and an inside-the-park home run.

Centerfielder Owen McCarron, State's leading hitter, banged out two singles in four trips.

FSU jumped off to a 1-0 start in the second when Copps doubled off the right-center scoreboard and came home on Dale Koch's first single. Copps' round-tripper in the fourth made it 2-0.

DECIDING RUNS

The Seminoles pushed across the deciding runs in the sixth after two outs. Shortstop Dick Howser singled, stole second, and scored on catcher Bill Westendick's single. Westendick stole second and Koch drove him in with another single.

Auburn mustered its two runs in the sixth on Pat Duke's infield hit and singles by Jackie Burkett and Lloyd Nix.

McCarron tied the alltime Florida State stolen base record when he swiped second in the fifth inning. He now shares the mark of 14 stolen bases with Lamar Brown (1949).
