

Florida State's Frank Slusser blanked Florida Southern on two singles for the first five innings, then watched from the sideline as the Seminoles routed the Mocs, 11-1, here yesterday.

It was the third triumph in 11 days for the senior right-hander, who has allowed only four earned runs in 43 innings this season. Slusser, author of a no-hitter against Miami, now owns a 5-0 record and a remarkable earned-run average.

Danny Litwhiller's Seminoles, racking up their 12th victory against five losses, built up an 11-0 lead before Slusser retired after five innings. It was their 11th straight triumph over the Moccasins and their 17th in the last 18 games with Florida Southern.

Litwhiller used 19 players yes-

terday and eight of them shared in an 11-hit attack on Southern's Bob Zammit and Ken Hollenborg. Centerfielder Owen McCarron, rightfielder Mike Copps, and catcher Bill Westendick collected two hits each.

Westendick drove in three runs with a single and an inside-the-park home run. Copps had a perfect day, bagging two singles, a walk, and a sacrifice fly.

Fred Kenney worked three innings and Jack Nelson one in relief of Slusser. The Seminoles played errorless ball for the second straight game. It was the second straight series sweep for the rebounding Seminoles, who shut out the Mocs, 5-0, behind Tommy Garcia Monday night.

State meets Stetson's Hatters in a two-game series opening at DeLand Friday, opposes Miami in Miami next Monday and Tuesday.

McCarron's triple, a walk to shortstop Dick Howser, an error, and Copps' sacrifice fly chalked up two FSU runs in the first. An error and Slusser's single made it 3-0 in the second.

Two more Seminole runs crossed in the third, on a walk to Copps and Westendick's home run that eluded Moc centerfielder Ron Akins. The Seminoles parlayed singles by Copps, McCarron, and Ray Bazzell, a walk, and three errors for their final six runs in the fifth.
