DELAND—Senior Righthander Fred Kenney put out the fire in the late innings for Florida State here yesterday to give the Seminoles a 4-2 victory over Stetson.

The Seminoles and Matadors were to wrap up their two-game series at Deland today, with Southerwood Jones, RHP (2-2) scheduled to start for Deland.

Kenney saved the victory for Seminoles ace Frank Glusker, who won the last six innings. It was Glusker's sixth straight win and his eighth this year.

SEMINOLES LEAD 3-0

Glusker had shown signs of tiring when Stetson got its two runs in the fourth, and after George Stetson's double in the sixth inning, Deland Coach Danny Lawler brought on Kenney.

Kenney got the Seminoles out of the inning on two pop-ups and a fly ball, then pitched his way out of another jam in the ninth when he retired first baseman Larry Stowe to end the ball game with two runs on base.

The Seminoles got off to a good start against Stetson hurler Dick Southerwood with two runs in the top of the first, singled by shortstop Dick Bowser, leftfielder Jerry Stowe and rightfielder Mike Coppa did the damage, with Coppa hit driving in both runs.

Stowe added another in the fifth when centerfielder Owen McCarran stepped to deep left-center and caught when Stetson shortstop Buddy Weaver hit the relay throw for a double. A double by Stetson's left fielder, centerfielder Stowe, in the sixth inning, the Seminoles' winning run, and the home run by Stowe and Mike Coppa in the seventh.

ter, had two hits and set a new school record for stolen bases by stealing second after beating out an infield hit. The speedy outfielder now has 15 for the season, breaking the old record of 14 set by Lamar Brown in 1949.

Stetson's two runs off Glusker in the sixth came on a single by Stowe, a double by Maltrick, a single by centerfielder Harry Conner and a throwing error by State third baseman Dale Koch.

Glusker has given up just six earned runs in 40 innings this year and owns a 1.10 earned-run-average.

The victory gives Florida State a 12-5 season record, while the loss dropped Stoneman to the .500 mark at 8-8.
