

Junior Charlie Rodgers and sophomore Jack Dull each powered two home runs as Florida State swept a double-header from Auburn, 8-4 and 11-3, here yesterday.

Coach Danny Litwhiler hoped Seminole baseball stayed as hot in the opener of a two-game series with Georgia's Bulldogs here today. Single games are scheduled for Seminole Field at 3:30 today and tomorrow.

Both Rodgers' and Dull's home runs came back to back in separate games against Auburn's defending Southeastern Conference champions. Rodgers, letterman first baseman from Jacksonville, hit his first one in the seventh inning of the first game, tying the score at 4-4.

A walk, Dull's sacrifice, and Dale Koch's single gave FSU a 5-4 lead before Rodgers smacked a three-run homer in the eighth inning.

In the second game Dull hit a leadoff homer in the third inning after Auburn had grabbed a 3-2 lead. The Tallahassee "rookie" repeated the stunt with two Seminoles on base to trigger an eight-run uprising in the fourth inning.

The Tribe got fine pitching from Duni Nelson and Jerry Horne in the first game, with Horne getting the victory in relief; Frank Davis worked the seven-inning second game, yielding only four singles.

Seven Auburn pitchers surrendered 19 hits in the two games, with Jim Shirley and Porter Gilbert the losers. The two triumphs made it four in a row for FSU

over Auburn and gave the Seminoles a 7-4 lead in the series.

Besides Dull and Rodgers, other leading hitters for FSU were Koch (4 for 9), Neil Martin (3 for 4), and Bob Clem (3 for 6).

With four home runs as a starter, the Seminoles may be headed for a banner year in circuit blows. Last year, the Tribe hit a record-tying number of 16 home runs in winning 21 of 28 games.
