

Sunshine State teams took it on the chin last night as North Carolina and Illinois won opening games in Florida State's fourth annual invitational baseball tournament at Centennial Field.

Unbeaten North Carolina (3-0) ran up a 9-0 lead, then checked a late Florida State rush for an 11-9 victory in the first game of the two-night doubleheader. It was the second loss for the Seminoles after eight triumphs.

Illinois shortstop Bob Klaus performed like his major-league brother, Billy Klaus, in sparking the Illini to a 12-4 romp over Florida in the second game.

The teams switch around for a twin bill today, with North Carolina meeting Florida at 5 p.m. and PSU facing Illinois at 7:30. Both games are set for Centennial Field.

Duke and Michigan enter the journey tomorrow with Western Michigan and Michigan State rounding out the eight-team field Monday.

North Carolina lefthander Ben Hammett was working on a neat four-hitter against PSU when he tired in the eighth in-

ning. Two walks and a single filled the bases before the Seminoles chased home six runs off reliever John Stott.

As it turned out, Walter Rabb's Tar Heels scored the deciding runs off lefthander Doug Walker — normally an outfielder — in the ninth. North Carolina had eight lefthanded batters in its starting lineup.

The Seminoles scored three more runs in the ninth before Johnny Johnson put out the fire.

Rightfielder Johnny Burgwyn paced North Carolina's 14-hit attack with three singles and a double. Second baseman Bob Clem and first baseman Charlie Rodgers had two hits each for PSU.

Klaus was a one-man wrecking gang for Illinois. The 5-10, 160-pound senior drove in four runs with two singles, a double, and a tremendous home run over the left field wall at Centennial. He gave some 15 major league scouts on hand an eyeful with two sparkling defensive plays

that stifled Florida threats.

Illinois righthander Terry Gellinger pitched the route, fanning 12 Gators and spacing out eight hits. The Illini bunched 12 of their 13 hits off Sid Smith and Dick Lopez into three big innings. Bobby Gelssinger had a single and triple for Florida.
