Three teams — University of Michigan, Michigan State, and Western Michigan — fell by the wayside yesterday to give every tournament entry at least one tournament loss.

UP FINALLY WINS

It was a rough day for Michigan teams. Florida, winless in three previous journey starts, handed Michigan its first setback, 6-5. Illinois spoiled Western Michigan's tournament debut, 3-0,

and PSU did likewise to Michigan State, 5-2, in the first game of a Centennial Field twin bill last night.

Duke's Blue Devils came from behind to nudge Florida State, 6-3, in the second game.

North Carolina (2-1) and Florida (1-3) have completed tournament action. The other six teams see action today with Michigan State and Illinois meeting in a 1:30 p.m. Seminole Field game.

Tonight's Centennial Field doubleheader pits Duke against Michigan at 5, and Western Michigan against PSU at 7:30.

Sophomore righthander Jim Daniel spaced out six hits in pitching PSU to its 5-2 triumph over Michigan State. The Seminoles cracked a 2-2 tie with two runs in the eighth inning and added an insurance run in the ninth.

RACK UP 10

The Tribe bagged 10 hits off Michigan State's Brook Tilley and Craig Van Sciver, with second baseman Bob Clem, shortstop Jack Dull, and centerfielder Ray Bazzell getting two hits apiece.

Catcher Art Browning blasted a three-run home run in the eighth inning to propel Duke to its 6-3 nod over the Seminoles. Trailing, 3-2, the Blue Devils pushed across the tying run before Browning hit his towering homer off losing pitcher Jerry Hohne.

Duke left-hander Ron Kalish allowed PSU only five hits—two by heavy-hitting Clem. A stylish Miami Beach product, Kalish struck out 10. Ace Parker's Blue Devils managed seven hits off Hohne, who fanned 11 Duke batters.

Florida came from behind three times in edging Michigan, 6-5. The Gators scored the tying and winning runs in the bottom of the ninth.

Catcher Mickey Ellenburg and shortstop Pat Frohock belted two-run home runs for Florida. First baseman Bill Roman smacked a two-run homer for Michigan. Florida ace Ray Oestricher got the victory in relief. George Weemhoff, victim of two unearned runs, was the loser. Centerfielder Jack Mogg had three hits for Michigan.

BEST PITCHING

Sophomore Paul Arneson pitched the tournament's finest game to date in checking favored Western Michigan with two hits in Illinois' 3-0 win over the Broncos. It was the season opener for Western Michigan, third-place finisher in last year's College World Series.

Rightfielder Len Grabowski's infield single and shortstop Frank Quillo's double were the only hits for Western Michigan. Illinois shortstop Bobby Klaus hit an eight-inning home run, his second of the tournament.
