

Righthander Ron Fraser pitched a neat five-hitter as Florida State bounced back in its own invitational tournament last night for a 5-1 victory over Duke's Blue Devils.

In earlier tournament games yesterday, Michigan State broke into the win column with a 7-2 triumph over Duke, and Western Michigan's Broncos scored twice with two out in the eighth innings to subdue Michigan, 7-6.

Seven games remain in the round-robin tournament, with four scheduled today and the final three tomorrow.

Western Michigan and Michigan opened today's program at 12 noon. Duke and Michigan State were scheduled for the second half of the Seminole Field doubleheader at 3.

Tonight, the Seminoles play a twin bill at Centennial Field, facing Western Michigan at 5 and Michigan at 7:30.

Fraser displayed sharp control in picking up his third victory of the season against Duke last night. He scattered five hits, walked only one while fanning eight. He lost his shutout bid in the seventh when Pete Maynard's single and stolen base and Butch Allie's single produced the lone Duke run.

The Seminoles took a 2-0 lead in the fifth on a walk, singles by Ray Bazzell and Jack Dull, and an infield out. The Tribe added three more runs in the sixth inning on two walks and singles by Bazzell and third baseman Dale Koch.

Bazzell and Dull sparked FSU's 9-hit attack with three hits each. Leftlander Mike Lehrhoff was the loser for Duke.

Danny Litwhiler's Tribe turned in their first errorless game of the season behind Fraser. FSU is now 4-3 in the tournament. Duke is 2-4.

Leftfielder Larry Buchanan's two-out single chased home the tying and winning runs in Western Michigan's 7-6 squeeze past Michigan. Both teams bagged 11 hits, with Western Michigan's Larry Bekanger collecting three hits and Michigan's Dick Syring getting three.

Ron White picked up the victory in relief. Jim Bradshaw was the loser in relief. It was Western Michigan's third straight tourney triumph after an opening loss.

Michigan State won its first game in four starts with its 7-2 nod over Duke. The Spartans combined tight pitching by Mickey Sinks, who worked a four-hitter, and timely hitting.

Michigan State had seven hits off Duke's John Jenkins.

Michigan catcher Syring had the day's only home run.
