

Danny Litwhiler is working today toward his second set of 100 victories as a college baseball coach.

The former National League outfielder, now in his fifth year of teaching baseball to Florida ninth, was rewarded yesterday with win No. 100. The Seminoles drummed up their second largest uprising of the year for the occasion, waiting past University of Tampa, 19-1.

### BEST TOTAL

In the process, FSU collected its biggest hit total in years, bagging 22 safeties in 44 official trips to the plate.

Litwhiler's Garnet and Gold teams have a five-year record of 100-35. This campaign, the Tribe is 16-8.

There were hitting stars aplenty yesterday. Two standouts were sophomore second baseman Bob Clem, who banged four singles and a double before the Spartans finally retired him on a sharp drive to center, and sophomore left fielder John King, who slapped five singles in six trips.

Clem's spree hiked his team-leading average to an even .500 (24 for 48), a record pace for the Seminoles.

Other batting heroes were

junior rightfielder Neil Martin, who drove in three runs with a triple and home run; first baseman Charlie Rodgers, who drove home four runs with a single and bases-loaded double; soph shortstop Jack Dull, who plated three runs with a single and double, and catcher Bill Westendick, who capped a 10-run second inning with a two-run blast over the left field fence.

FSU paraded 15 men to bat in that giant 10-run second, with all runs scoring after two were out. Three walks and six straight hits had starter Thad Chapman on the ropes.

### FIRST WIN

Dull Nelson breezed to his first victory. The big righthander was touched for four singles in the six innings he worked. Tampa spoiled FSU's shutout bid in the ninth with three straight singles off relief pitcher Jerry Hohne.

Dean Burroughs had three of seven hits for Tampa, which lost only its fourth game in 14 starts.

It was "faculty and staff appreciation day" and the final home game for FSU, which will be idle until opening a five-game road swing against Georgia Teachers, Georgia and Auburn May 9.
