SEMINOLE SMOKE SIGNALS

Four is a big number for Florida State's 1959 baseball team. With only four lettermen back this year, the Seminoles won 20 games for the fourth straight season and will be making their fourth consecutive appearance in the four-team NCAA District 3 playoffs. Florida State closed its regular season with four triumphs and have four regulars hitting over .300.

The Seminoles swept through the 1957 District 3 playoffs to gain the College World Series at Omaha, where they lost to Penn State and Connecticut.

Coach Danny Litwhiler will lose only one senior from Florida State's regular tournament lineup-team captain Dale Koch who shifted from third base to shortstop late this season. Ten members of FSU's 22-player tournament squad are sophomores, nine are juniors, only three are seniors. Fourteen of the 22 played high school baseball in Florida. Four are from Georgia, two from New Jersey, and one each from Virginia and Wisconsin.

Of the Tribe's top five hitters, four are sophomores. Soph second baseman Bob Clem of Atlanta set individual records with 41 hits and a .461 batting average. The former single-season highs of 38 hits and a .422 batting average were set in 1956 by two-year All-America shortstop Dick Howser, who graduated last year. Soph third baseman Jack Dull (.327) drove in a record 34 runs and was the slugging leader with four doubles and five home runs. Junior rightfielder Neil Martin (.356) numbered 12 extra-base hits among his 31 hits and drew a record number of walks (34). Sophomore outfielders Doug Walker and John King hit .333 and .305, respectively.

Florida State's pitchers had a combined earned run average of 2.47 with sophomore Frank Davis (7-2) posting a 1.60 ERA and soph Jim Daniel (3-1) turning in a 1.54 ERA.

COACH DANNY LITWHILER

On a warm, sunny day at St. Petersburg's Al Lang Field last January, former professional baseball greats from all corners of the nation gathered for the fourth annual Old Timers' game.

It was a scoreless duel until the bottom of the sixth inning, when a husky
National League standout of bygone days strode to the plate. He was Florida State's
Danny Litwhiler, who promptly settled the issue with a booming home run out of the park.

The game-winning smash was typical of Litwhiler's determination, as a player and as a teacher.

Danny has been described as one of the most imaginative and dynamic coaches in college baseball. When he came to Florida State five years ago it was his expressed desire to put the Seminoles out front in the collegiate baseball scramble.

In five seasons, his Seminoles have won 104 games while losing only 36, appearing in four District playoffs and one College World Series. It adds up to a .743 percentage, a championship reading in anybody's league.

There was an extra measure of success during the 1957 and 1958 seasons. One of Litwhiler's prodigies, a 145-pound shortstop Dick Howser of West Palm Beach, was named to the NCAA's first-team All-America squad both years. Twelve players from the 1958 Seminole roster have signed with major league clubs.

Litwhiler has the perfect background to be a good baseball coach. He built up a vast storehouse of ideas during his major league playing days with the St. Louis Cardinals, Philadelphia Phillies, Cincinnati Reds, and the old Boston Braves.

Danny went down in the books for several outstanding performances before retiring as an active player in 1950. He batted safely in 21 straight games in his first major league season. He belted a home run in every National League park in 1941.

In 1942 he became the first major leaguer to play a complete errorless season. He handled 317 chances in 151 games that year and over a period of two years set a record of playing 187 consecutive games without an error.

2-Litwhiler

The glove Litwhiler used in that string was retired in baseball's Hall of Fame.

In 1942 and 1943 he tied a National League record for the most years-two-leading in fielding percentage by an outfielder appearing in 100 or more games.

Litwhiler, 42, was born in Ringtown, Pa., and is a graduate of Bloomsburg (Pa.) State Teachers College.

After retiring as an active player, Danny coached Cincinnati in 1951 and has managed minor league clubs at Fargo, N.D., Wilkes-Barre, Pa., Jamestown, N.Y., and Duluth, Minn.

ASSISTANT COACH RONALD MELTON

A former standout catcher for the Seminoles (1949-52), Ronald Melton is thoroughly familiar with the diamond sport at Florida State. He's been guiding Seminole baseball players since 1955, when he came back to his alma mater as assistant baseball coach and assistant athletic business manager.

"Ronnie" was born in Alabama but is a long-time resident of Tallahassee.

TRAINER DON FAULS

Don Fauls, a native of Ithaca, N.Y., came to Florida State in 1954 and has done an outstanding job easing Seminole aches and pains. Fauls graduated from Ithaca College in 1948 with a degree in physio-therapy.

Don served as trainer of the Greensboro, N.C., Patriots of the Carolina Baseball League before joining the St. Louis Cardinals chain as a trainer at Omaha, Neb. He came to Florida State three years later.
