

**JACKSONVILLE** — For the fourth time in eight starts this season, Florida State's baseball opportunists came from behind to pull a game out of the fire here yesterday.

Navy's Middies were the vic-

tims this time, blowing a 4-0 lead as Danny Litwhiler's Seminoles rallied for an 8-4 decision in 10 innings.

It was the sixth victory against two losses for the Tribe.

Junior righthander Frank Davis survived early trouble and went the full 10 innings for his fourth straight pitching triumph. He is unbeaten this season.

The heavy-hitting Seminoles collected 10 hits—one more than Navy—but six FSU safeties went for extra bases. Catcher Bill Westendick of Tallahassee slammed a double and a home run—his second—to drive in three FSU runs.

Leftfielder Gene McCormick of Miami batted in three more Seminole runs with a double and single. Centerfielder Bob Clem bagged a single and triple to

keep his hitting streak alive at eight games.

Team captain Ray Bazzell had his seven-game hitting string snapped, going 0-for-4.

After Navy reached Davis for three runs in the second inning and a single run in the third, the Middies were blanked for the final seven innings. Davis fanned 11, walked none, and retired good-hitting leftfielder Joe Bellino — 3-touchdown hero of Navy's football rout of Army last November—without a hit.

Trailing 4-0 entering the seventh inning, the Tribe broke the ice for two runs on a walk and error, McCormick's single, and Westendick's double to left. A walk to Bazzell and triples by Clem and first baseman Doug Walker produced two runs and a 4-4 tie in the eighth.

The Seminoles erupted for runs in the 10th after two were out. An error, a walk, and McCormick's double chased home two runs. Then Westendick slammed a two-run homer to provide some insurance.

Davis, who now has issued only six walks and struck out 34 batters in 34 innings, fanned seven Navy players in the fifth, sixth, and seventh innings, striking out the side in the sixth.

The Seminoles pulled off their 10th double play of the year when rightfielder Jimmy White doubled off a Navy runner at first to end the game.

FSU meets Georgia and Georgia Tech in four games on the road later this week.
