

Hoping to bounce back after a 4-2 loss to Mississippi College yesterday, Florida State's baseball nine opens a two-game series with state-rival Florida Southern here today.

The Seminoles and Miss are scheduled for 2:30 p.m. games at Seminole Field today and tomorrow.

FSU left 11 runners stranded and had two others put down trying to steal as Mississippi College reversed its 4-2 Monday loss to the Times.

The Choctaws from Clinton, Miss., jumped off to a 3-0 first-inning lead and were never headed. They added their fourth run in the seventh.

The Seminoles tallied single runs in the first and fourth innings and looked like they might tie it up in the eighth. With none out FSU put runners on second and third on a walk and

pinch-hitter Bob Madison's single to center. But pitcher Jerry Nevels, who won his fourth game without a loss, retired the Seminoles without damage.

Both teams batted seven hits with second baseman Ray Russell getting two singles for FSU. Junior righthander Jim Daniel was the loser.

FSU now has an 8-4 record against college nines and a 9-6 mark overall.
