Sparkling defensive work by centerfielder Al Davidson and steady pitching by righthander Ken-Hallenborg led Florida Southern to a 5-3 baseball verdict over Florida State yesterday.

The two-rum decision gave the red-hot Moccasins a sweep of their two-game series with the Seminoles, who have lost three games in a row. Winner in 17 of 20 games this season, Florida Southern turned back FSU, 11-4, on Wednesday.

Seventeen Seminole runners reached base yesterday, but only three of them scored, those after two outs and two strikes on centerfielder Bob Clem in the ninth inning. Clem lofted a fast ball over the right-field fence for a three-run homer that spoiled Hallenborg's shutout attempt.

Hallenborg surrendered 12 hits, but walked only one and struck out six. He left 10 FSU runners stranded,

Davidson, a fleet-footed outfielder, stymied two FSU threats with brilliant defensive maneuvers. He made a running, overthe-shoulder catch of Doug Walker's drive to the base of the centerfield wall with Seminoles on second and third in the fifth inning. In the eighth inning, Davidson threw a perfect peg to third base to nail catcher Hank Ross going from first to third on pinch-hitter Gene McCormick's single.

It was a tough loss for FSU pitcher Frank Davis, who suffered his first defeat after six triumphs. Davis was touched for eight hits and gave up three earned runs in the seven innings he worked. But seven Seminole errors—a season high—open the gate for Moc scoring.

Rightfielder Jack. Garrison paced his team-leading average at .400 with a single and a home run in five trips.

FSU now has a season record of nine wins and eight defeats (8-6 against college nines). The Tribe meets Georgia Southern College in a two-game series here Monday and Tuesday.

A scheduled two-game series with Florida at Gainesville to-day and tomorrow has been post-poned until May 9-10 because of memorial services for FSU President Robert Strozier.
