For the second straight year, junior centerfielder Bob Clem and junior pitcher Frank Davis have reaped the majority of Florida State University's individual baseball honors.

Final 22-game regular-season statistics reveal Clem, 20-year-old Atlanta product who was shifted to center field after earning All-America honors as a second baseman in 1969, led Coach Danny Lit-

whiler's Seminoles in seven departments.

Clem-led in hits (36), doubles (7), (riples (5), total bases (62), stolen bases (10), runs-batted-in (24) and batting average (.303). Clem, who had a school-record batting average of .436 as a sophomore, this year tied a single-season Seminole record of 5 triples set by Bob Hudson in 1953.

Davis, righthand control artist from Miami, posted his second straight 8-3 record to set a school record for career victories. In two seasons, Davis' 16 victories erase the old career mark of 15 games won by Tommy Garcia over four campaigns (1955-58).

Third baseman Ray Bazzell, team captain from Panama City, was runnerup for the batting title with a .356 average, Bazzell led in runs with 26 and walks with 21. Second baseman Jack Dull of Tallahassee led in home runs for the second year in a row. Dull, a junior, had hour home runs, one more than Clem.

Clem's 1960 average of .393 gives him a two-year career average of .510. Of Clem's 80 hits for the Tribe, 24 have gone for extra bases.

Davis has a remarkable two-year record. In pitching 175 innings for the Seminoles, he has won 16 of 22 decisions, compiled a 2.05 earned-run average, walked only 31 batters, and struck out 142, three short of Garcia's career strike-out record of 145.

In winning 13 of 22 games this season, the Seminoles set a school double-play record with 24 twin killings, four more than the 1951 record.

Tampa sophomore Jimmy White, who finished third in batting with a .348 average, threw out a whopping total of seven runners in 22 games from his right field station. White started four double plays.
