

Senior righthander Frank Davis, Florida State's all-time leading pitcher in victories and strikeouts, goes after his 18th career triumph as FSU continues its four-game series with Duke today.

The Seminoles snapped a 2-2 tie with an eight-run barrage in the seventh inning yesterday to down the Blue Devils, 10-6, in the series opener. It was the season opener for Duke, ranked 10th nationally in college baseball circles.

#### **RATED 13TH**

FSU, ranked 13th in the season's first poll out this week, has a 6-2 record.

Duke ace Don Altman, whose .082 earned run average last year was the best in college baseball, was the loser yesterday although he gave up only five hits and three earned runs in 6½ innings. After Altman departed in the midst of FSU's biggest inning of the year, the Seminoles collected six unearned runs off reliever Bob Turner.

Ray McShane, junior lefty, pitched the route for FSU, giving up 11 hits and three earned runs for his first victory.

First baseman Doug Walker and catcher Buddy Teagle each had two of FSU's eight hits. Left-fielder Rex McKinley led Duke with three singles.

FSU jumped off to a 2-0 start on Walker's single, a walk to second baseman Jack Dull, and shortstop Roger Zimmerman's double in the second inning. Duke tied it in the sixth on a double by second baseman Garry Miller, singles by Ronnie Davis and Lynn Fader, and an infield double play.

FSU's eight runs in the seventh came on a walk, three Duke er-

rors, and singles by Walker, third baseman George Fergusson, Teagle, rightfielder Neil Martin and Dull. Duke scored twice in both the eighth and ninth frames, and McShane retired pinch-hitter Art Browning with the bases filled to end the game.

## SHARP WORK

Dull batted in two runs for FSU and was the fielding standout. In the fourth inning, Dull grabbed a hot smash by McKinley behind second and turned it into a double play. With two Duke runs already across in the sixth, Dull turned another difficult chance into a double play to choke off a Blue Devil threat.

Centerfielder Jimmy White, out since the season opener with a foot injury, returned to the Seminole lineup yesterday.
