Getting much mileage out of five hits and the best pitching job of the season from senior Frank Davis, Florida State's baseball team won its second straight game over Duke, 1-0, here yesterday.

The teams play the third game in a four-game series at Seminole Field today, with senior Jim Daniel (1-1) the probable FSU Ditcher.

Davis spaced out six hits in hurling FSU's first shutout since the eighth game of the 1959 season. The Miami righthander bicked up his 18th career triumph, an all-time FSU high, and ran his career strikeout record to 162 in fanning six Blue Devils.

The Seminoles managed only five hits off Duke lefthander Ron Kalish. But one of them would have been sufficient, as it turned out.

Third baseman George Fergusson hit a tremendous drive over b the 411-foot centerfield wall to open the second inning. In the c

eighth inning, second baseman Jack Dull hit a line drive over the left-field fence at the 360-foot mark for his fourth homer in nine games. The Seminoles had grabbed a 2-0 first-inning lead without a hit. Centerfielder Gary Elliott walked and stole second. First baseman Doug Walker walked and Elliott stole third. With Dull at bat, FSU worked a neat double steal, with Elliott scoring and Walker taking second. Walker crossed when Duke's rightfielder dropped Roger Zimmerman's fly in short right. More than 1,000 watched the fastest game of the season here. The game was completed in one hour, 57 minutes. Duke had runners on base in every inning. But no Blue Devil got past second base as the Semi-

noles pulled of two haystone double plays. Dall Zimmerson and Walker have figured in four twin killings in the past two games.

Jimmy White, back in the lineup after a foot injury, made a runsaving grab of a low liner in the third inning.

Ranked 13th nationally, FSU has a 7-2 record. Tenth-ranked Duke is still looking for its first triumph after losing two to FSU.
