

STATESBORO, Ga.—Tight pitching by senior righthanders Frank Davis and Jim Daniel and the batting of first baseman Doug Walker and rightfielder Neil Martin helped Florida State's baseball nine to a doubleheader sweep over Georgia Southern here yesterday.

The Seminoles won the first game, 6-4, and the nightcap, 9-1. Both games were seven-inning affairs by agreement.

DOUBLE SWEEP

The two-game sweep lifted FSU's season record to 14-4 with 10 games remaining.

Davis and Daniel limited the Eagles to a total of 11 hits for the day and six of those were of the infield variety. Davis, picking up his third 1961 win and the 19th of his Seminole career, surrendered six hits and ran his career strikeout record to 175 with four whiffs.

Daniel was even stingier, yielding only five hits and one unearned run in gaining his fourth

victory this season and the 10th of his career. Daniel walked five and struck out 10.

FSU hammered out 23 hits—11 in the first game and a dozen in the second—off six Georgia Southern pitchers. Walker had six hits, three singles in the first game and a single and a pair of booming triples in the second.

MARTIN DOUBLES

Martin collected a double and three singles in seven trips during the day. Daniel and George Fergusson and Hal Mangin, who split the playing time at third base, were the only Seminoles held hitless.

Southern jumped off to a 3-1 lead in the first inning of the first game, but FSU tied the score in the fourth inning and wrapped it up in the fifth. The Seminoles took an early lead in the second game and were never in trouble.

Soph shortstop Roger Zimmerman, second baseman Jack Dull, and Walker pulled off the Tribe's 18th double play in 18 games in the second game.
