 00 games here today with
 00 lanky Jim Daniel set to
 37 pitch the finale of a two-
 game series with Florida
 Southern.

■ The Seminoles pushed their
 record to 15-4 with a hard-earned
 5-4 triumph over the Moccasins
 here last night. A two-run eighth-
 inning home run by shortstop
 Roger Zimmerman and ninth-in-
 ning pitching heroics by Frank
 Davis enabled the Tribe to take
 its fourth straight victory.

Florida Southern had the Sem-
 inoles down by 3-0 after the first
 inning. But junior lefthander Ray
 McShane settled down to blank
 the Mocs until he ran into hot
 water in the ninth.

By that time, FSU had rallied
 to take a 5-3 lead on the strength
 of some timely hitting and base-
 running.

With one out in the last of the
 ninth, the Moe's Mike Gutierrez
 and John Gould singled to put

the tying run on base. On came
 Davis, FSU's all-time winningest
 pitcher.

Davis struck out John Mack for
 the second out but John Buc-
 ciarelli singled to right field to
 load the bases as Neil Maryin
 fired the ball into the plate. Davis
 then walked Jack Garrison to
 force in Southern's fourth run and
 leave the bases jammed.

On a 3-2 pitch, Davis got first
 baseman-pitcher Chuck Anderson
 to end the game and preserve
 McShane's fourth win in five de-
 cisions.

Nine of the 10 Seminoles joined
 in a 13-hit attack on Ken Hollen-
 borg and Anderson.

A walk and four singles gave
 Southern its three runs in the first.
 FSU scored one in the second
 when Zimmerman singled, and
 was forced out by Madison. Madi-
 son then stole second and third

e and scored on catcher Buddy
t Teagle's single to short.

FSU tied the score with two
r runs in the third. Martin led with
a single and scored when leftfield-
er Jimmy White tripled on a hit-
and-run play. First baseman Doug
Walker then doubled home White.

No one scored from the third
until FSU's winning rally in the
eighth. Third baseman Hal Man-
gin singled and then Zimmerman
unloaded a 385-foot home run far
over the left field wall. It was
the second homer for the soph-
shortstop this season.

Zimmerman also started a
double play, the Tribe's 19th in 19
games this year.
