r iorida State's baseball team nudged by Miami, 9-8, in 10 innings here yesterday.

Leftfielder Bill Williamson and shortstop Woody Woodward, both playing their first year on the Seminole varsity, went 4-for 5 at the plate, both clouted home runs.

It was the 15th straight game in which Woodward has hit safely. His ground single scored the winning run in the bottom of the 10th. Williamson stole a couple of bases and scored three runs.

The bonus inning was necessary when Miami roared back with four runs in the seventh and three more in the eighth to knot the count at 8-8, after FSU had grabbed an 8-1 advantage.

Pitcher Jack Ross, who got credit for the victory, his first decision, started off the 10th with a single to center.

Rightfielder Gary Elliott sacrificed runner Dwight Smith to second. Bob Madison was walked intentionally, and Williamson popped to short. Woodward followed with his game-winning rap,

Madison, whi smashed two home runs in four trips and the two sophs, accounted for the bulk of FSU's 16-hits attack.

Madison and Woodward had three runs batted in apiece.

The victory avenged Monday's Miami triumph over the Seminoles. FSU now leads the series 22-4. Monday's victory was Miami's first since 1958 over the Tallahassee club:

FSU used Woodward's home run, following Williamson's walk for two runs in the first inning. In the third, Madison hit a 2-run homer, Hal Mangin doubled one run home and Woodward, who had singled, came home on a wild pitch to account for four more runs.

Madison and Williamson hit back to back home runs for two runs in the sixth.

FSU moves north for games with Clemson on Thursday and Duke at Durham, N. C., on Friday and Saturday.
