Frank Echols, the third pitcher used by FSU, gave up the final five Clemson runs and took the loss.

In the fifth FSU pushed across seven runs on four hits, four errors, a walk and a wild pitch to take the lead. Clemson's drive in seventh put it at 11-0. The Seminoles had just tied it in the eighth when Nixon's blast put it away.
