

GASTONIA, N. C.—The Florida State Seminoles, who went on the warpath after losing their first game to Florida in the NCAA District 3 baseball playoffs beat Wake Forest twice Monday for the district championship.

The Seminoles, piqued at their 1-0 loss to favored Florida in the opening game of the double elimination tournament last Thursday, won their next four games to carry the district colors to the NCAA finals in Omaha next week.

Florida State went into Monday's action the numerical underdog, needing two victories to take the championship.

Florida State got the lead in the first game, getting a run in the first inning. The Seminoles' pitcher, Jerry to throw the game.

The second game, started immediately after the first, was tied 2-2 at the end of nine innings. The Seminoles broke the tie in the bottom of the 11th with a single run to win 3-2.

The Seminoles will rest today, leave Gastonia tomorrow morning for the long bus ride to Omaha. FSU will meet Santa Clara in the College World Series on Monday night. The California team had a 31-6 record in regular season play.

Coaches and writers honored four players at Gastonia in a selection of superlatives.

FSU shortstop Woody Woodward, whose hits in the play-

offs included two homers and four doubles, was voted "best infielder" and "best hitter." FSU left-hander Ray McShane was acclaimed "best pitcher." Wake Forest's Wayne Martin was named "best outfielder."

An All-District 3 team was also announced. It includes players from teams in the district who were not in the playoffs.

The team: first base — Tom Brown, Maryland; second base — Joe Hatalla, West Virginia; shortstop — Donnie Kessinger, Mississippi; third base — Tom Moore, Florida; outfielder — Gene Champion, Florida A&M; outfielder — Larry Nichols, Auburn; outfielder — Roger Coon, Wake Forest; catcher — Bud- dy Teagle, FSU; pitcher — Tom Shafer, West Virginia; pitcher — Frank Montgomery, Mississippi State.

This team was selected entirely on the basis of regular season play.

In yesterday's second game, Don Roth, Wake Forest righthander, had given up only six hits when Al Becaccio singled to open Florida State's half of the 11th inning.

Woodward was intentionally walked after Becaccio stole second. Roth struck out Gary Elliott and Teagle. Hal Mangin, with two strikes on him, lashed a single to left to bring Becaccio home with the winning run.

It would have been a close

play at the plate had the throw from left field been right on target.

Wake Forest took a 1-0 lead in the first when Billy Scripture homered. The Deacons' other run, in the eighth, was on a homer by Pat Williams.

FSU got one in the fifth. Mangin and George Rountree singled, with Mangin taking third on the latter blow and scoring as McShane forced Rountree at second.

The Seminoles tied it in the eighth when Mike Augustine doubled, went to third on Bob Madison's fly and scored on Becaccio's grounder.

In the first game, Florida State had a 6-0 lead. Wake Forest's Roger Coon hit a three-run homer in the bottom of the sixth and a three-run double in the seventh to cut Florida State's lead to 8-7. The Seminoles picked up two more runs in the top of the eighth to round out the scoring.

FSU had picked up single runs in the second and third, then erupted for four in the sixth as they batted around.

Billy Williamson's double, on the heels of a pair of singles, brought in two in the seventh. And in the eighth Woodward homered with Becaccio aboard on a single.

McShane pitched the first nine and two-thirds innings of the second game, limiting Wake Forest to its two runs on the pair

of homers. When he issued a walk and a single after two were on in the 10th, Allen Thomas came on in relief. Thomas wild-pitched the two runners to second and third but got out of the hole and set the Deacons down in the top of the 11th.
