

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) —

Florida State's baseball team is continuing its upset binge in the College World Series and tonight goes against Ithaca, a team with giant-killing tendencies.

The Seminoles, who got past Florida and Wake Forest in their District 3 playoffs, dumped No. 1 ranked Santa Clara, 5-1, in last night's opening round.

Ithaca, smallest school in the NCAA tournament, upset Missouri 5-1, and ran its perfect record to 18-0. FSU and Ithaca play at 8:30 (Tallahassee time) tonight. WTAL will broadcast it back to Tallahassee.

Florida State had to beat Santa Clara's celebrated righthander, Bob Garibaldi, to gain a berth in the winners' bracket along with Ithaca, Michigan and Holy Cross.

Larry Hawkins and Tom Davis combined in a three-hitter to beat the California team, filled with slingers.

They handled the slingers with a hit — but Hawkins couldn't get out until the Florida hitters chased him out in the seventh. A 162 batsman, got a 100-foot homer in the fifth, created a 1-1 tie that the Seminoles snapped with two runs in the fifth.

Hawkins walked seven and finally was yanked by Coach Dan-

ny Litwhiler in the eighth. He had escaped from a bases-loaded jam in the seventh and in the eighth he filled the bases again with one out on two walks and a hit batter.

But Davis came on and struck out a pinchhitter for the first out. Then he got out of the inning by retiring the next batter on a grounder.

Davis also had to work out of

a jam in the ninth. He walked two men with one out.

But he got the next two batters on fly balls for Florida State's first victory in three NCAA championship games.

The Seminoles scored one in the fourth on successive singles by Al Beccaccio, Woody Woodward and Bill Williamson. All three were line drives and Beccaccio's was the first hit off Gari-

baldi, who struck out nine in his 6 1-3 innings.

Garibaldi's homer tied it in the fifth.

The Seminoles snapped the tie with two out in the sixth. Buddy Teagle singled and advanced to third on Hal Mangin's double. George Rountree scored Teagle on a high-bounding single to the second baseman.

Mangin and Rountree then at-

tempted to execute a double steal. Mangin was caught at the plate, but dislodged the ball from catcher Ron Cook's glove for the run.

Florida State added two insurance tallies in the eighth. Mike Augustine doubled and Bob Madison scored him with a single. Madison promptly stole second and came around on two wild pitches by Garibaldi.

Then came the dramatics by Hawkins and finally Davis. The Florida State pitchers forced Santa Clara to leave eight runners stranded over the last three innings.

Michigan beat Texas 3-1 on Ron Tate's 2-out 2-run home in the ninth. Holy Cross nipped Color-

ado State College 4-3 in a pitcher's duel.
