

ATLANTA — Florida State's baseball team used two big innings to overpower Tech 10-5 in the first game of a double header Thursday, but the Yellow Jackets edged the Seminoles 5-4 in the second game.

The split left FSU's record at 18-9, while Georgia Tech finished its season 9-18.

Coach Danny Litwhiler's Seminoles are to meet Georgia at Athens today and tomorrow, ending the Tribe's road schedule.

Tech sophomore Ron Scharf held the Seminoles hitless for the first two innings in the opener, but FSU batted around in the third to bring home five runners.

After Tech had narrowed things

to 5-4 with a three-run fourth inning, the Seminoles wrapped up their victory with four runs in the seventh, on a pair of doubles, two wild pitches by Scharf and three Jacket errors.

Top batters for FSU were Gary Nichols, Jim Reed and George Rountree, who collected two hits each, and pinch-hitter Monte McBryde hit a two-run double in the seventh. Mickey Carmack and Dick Emerson whacked home runs for Tech.

Holding a 3-2 lead, Tech scored what proved to be the decisive run in the nightcap when Butch Harris hit a single, made second on a walk and scored on Bill Selby's single.

Slated to pitch against the Seminoles today was Don Woeltjen, who hurled a no-hitter against Tech May 3. Al Baccacio was to start on the mound for FSU.
