

ATHENS, Ga. — A four-run rally in the final two innings sent Florida State's baseball team to a 4-3 victory over Georgia Saturday.

Georgia's Charles Bagby frustrated the Seminoles for seven innings with his top-flight pitching, before blowing up in the eighth and ninth, when the victors massed seven hits into the winning runs.

The Bulldogs had gone ahead in the first inning, when a single by Carroll Minick, two bases on balls and Tom Reid's sacrifice fly produced one run. In the

third inning, Georgia added its final two runs on a single by Reid, two walks and an error.

Singles by Ken Suarez, Buddy Teagle and Jim Reed loaded the bases for the Seminoles in the eighth. With one out to go, Dave Dahlen whacked a single to bring two runners home.

Bill William's home run got the Tribe going in the ninth, and knotted things at 3-3. Jim Loftin cracked a single, went to second

on a sacrifice fly and scored when Teagle singled.

Winning pitcher was sophomore Marty Howell, who relieved Allen Thomas in the seventh, faced six batters and gave up no hits or runs.

The victory boosted Coach Danny Litwhiler's Seminoles to a 20-9 record. It was Georgia's last game of the season, and set the Bulldog's mark at 14-13.
