Nichols, a righthander, struck out 12 Seminoles in going the route for the winning Wildcats. From the third inning to the

eighth — with the exception of the sixth, when Mike Augustine reached first on balls — Nichols retired the Seminoles in order. He kept the Wikkeats In contention in the crucial extra - insings with a fine exhibition of control, then won his own game in the eleventh by whacking a single to drive home the deciding run.
