On the second pitch to Bob Wilcox, Augustine broke for second, drawing a throw which eluded second baseman Ron I James, and Reed came home. Wilcox then drilled a single to left, scoring Augustine. Howell had trouble in the seventh when rightfielder Fred Mayer tripled to the right center fence with two away. A pinch hit single by David Sonenburg scored Mayer; then Howell walked Oktavec to keep the Moc rally alive. Jim Hardoe's long drive to left looked bad, but junior Randy Brown, playing his first game for the Seminoles, was on the spot to haul it in. The Seminole cast of characters was much the same in the eighth inning when Howell drew a lead off walk from Huebner. Reed fouled off two bunt attempts, then lined a single, ad-
