

Florida State coach Fred Hatfield emptied his hat, both sleeves and the bench, but the Seminoles couldn't pull out a victory; and Florida Southern won 8-4 here yesterday afternoon.

The Moccasins scored in the second, third, fourth, fifth and a big ninth inning, as they rapped four FSU hurlers for ten hits to split with the Seminoles in a two-game series. Florida State won the first game, Monday, 5-2.

Sophomore righthander John Smith started for the Seminoles, but was lifted for a pinch-hitter in the third after Ken Heubner's towering two-run homer over the right centerfield fence gave the visitors a three run lead.

Smith was followed by Ken Creely, Monroe Hunt and Bob Kull, none of whom seemed to be able to stop the hot Southern bats.

Huebner, losing pitcher in the first game, played right field yesterday, and added a single to his home run. Centerfielder Fred Mayer was a constant irritation to the Seminoles with three hits and three stolen bases. Catcher Darryl Fulton also got two safeties for the Mocs.

Hatfield had said before the season started that the Seminoles had depth in every position, and he proceeded to prove the fact, on paper at least.

No less than 20 players participated yesterday in a scorekeeper's nightmare.

Smith was the first to go, giving way for pinch hitter Leon Chahub's single in the third. Chahub and Larry Johnson, who had led off the inning with a base hit, scored on singles by Jim Reed and Bob Wilcox.

Next in the pinch hit department came Tom Thomas who

drew a walk for Dave Dahlen in the sixth, with Gerry Chmielewski going to third. Meanwhile, Creely was on the mound and having trouble, giving up runs in each of the fourth and fifth frames.

Mike Haney pinched for Creely in the seventh and flied out. Monroe Hunt took the mound to start the eighth.

In the home half of the eighth, Gary Nichols made his first appearance of the season, and banged out a pinch hit single, scoring Ken Suarez. Swift Monty McBryde came in to run.

Murphy seemed to be tiring on the mound, so Hatfield announced left handed swinger Rick Hutchinson to hit for Hunt. However, Southern Coach Hal Smeltzly waved in lefthander Cooper Means from the bull pen.

Not to be outdone, Hatfield called in Paul Dirks from his first base coaching box to bat against Means. Dirks responded with a high foul in back of first which scored Chmielewski from third. Jim Reed struck out to end the inning.

Down only one run going into the last inning, Seminole fans began to take hope. Kull struck out Huebner, but back-to-back singles by Bob Lee and Fulton and a base on balls to Ron James loaded the bases.

The dangerous Mayer's bat seemed to have cooled when he hit a double play ball to Bill Bearse at short, but Reed's relay to first went astray and two more Southern runs were in. Mayer then stole second for the third time and scored on Jim Hardee's single.

The Seminoles loaded the bases in their half on a double by Mike Augustine and two walks by Means, however, Chmielewski could do no better than a grounder to second, ending the game.
