

Outfielder Bob Wilcox's two-run single in the seventh inning yesterday gave Florida State an 8-5 baseball victory over Clemson.

The Tigers, playing their first game of the year, cracked two early home runs and kept shelling FSU starter Cliff Ranew, but the strapping 6-5 junior college transfer held on. Clemson led 5-3 until the seventh, when pitcher Tom Chapman of the Tigers ran into some trouble of his own.

Chapman, who had allowed only three hits, gave up a single to the Seminoles' Gerry Chmielewski, then walked Bill Bearse, Jimmy Reed, and Mike Augustine in order. Chmielewski walked home with FSU's fourth run and Chapman walked to the dugout.

His replacement, Dale Smith, could do no better. Wilcox, back at FSU after sitting out a year, singled to bring home Bearse and Reed, and the Seminoles had a 6-5 lead and their second victory of the season.

Clemson, typically strong but young, jumped into a quick lead. Ben Marsella lifted the first pitch of the game over the left field fence and left fielder George Sutton followed with another homer, in the second, in the same spot. Ranew, a Norman, (Ga.) Junior College graduate, got into more trouble in the fourth when centerfielder Tom Pack singled to score two runs.

The Seminoles, however, won it in the seventh and poured it

on with two runs in the eighth. Two relievers, first baseman Mike Haney and pitcher Ken Creely hogged all the attention; Haney singled sharply to right, then came home on Creely's ground single.

Second baseman Jim Reed, walked, stole second then hustled home from second on Mike Augustine's infield single. Reed scored three times from his lead off slot.

Clemson meets the University of Tennessee Vols, in town after a two-game series at Jack-

sonville University, this morning at 11:30 at the FSU diamond. Later, at 3:30 this afternoon, Tennessee takes on Florida State.

Florida State and Clemson get together again Saturday at 3:30.
