

Florida State's Seminoles unlimbered their big war clubs Saturday and tomahawked both Clemson and Tennessee in an Alumni Weekend doubleheader.

The Seminoles clobbered opposing pitchers for 34 hits in the two game sweep which saw Clemson fall 12-6 in the morning, followed by Tennessee, 15-7 in the afternoon.

Gary Nichols' grand slam home run in the first inning put Clemson four runs in the hole and retired starter Dale Smith with no outs. Shortstop Larry Johnson followed with a three run homer in the second inning to give FSU a commanding 9-2 lead.

Tom Davis started for the Seminoles and lasted until midway through the fifth inning at which time Ken Creely came on with bases loaded to retire 13 batters in a row. FSU was leading 9-6 at the time.

Centerfielder Mike Augustine broke his three game slump with three hits in four times at bat, and Monty McBryde, starting his first game for the Seminoles in left field, drove in the first run with a single just before Nichols' circuit blow.

McBryde was just starting, however, against Tennessee, the Pensacola junior who was used primarily as a runner for All American catcher Buddy Teagle last season, collected four hits in five times at bat, scoring two runs and driving in one.

Catcher Ken Suarez, Teagle's stand-in last year and hier apparent this season, also blasted four for five, driving in three runs and scoring two.

Leftlander Marty Howell went

all the way for Florida State to win his second game of the season, and helped the cause along with three RBIs on a single and a sacrifice fly.

Tennessee's Volunteers showed some teeth, getting 12 hits off Howell, including a two run homer by shortstop Daryl Lowe in the seventh. Lowe had three hits in four trips and three runs batted in.

The Seminoles played errorless ball against Clemson, the first time this season. Florida State is now 4-2 with a marathon 13 day stand against eight

teams coming up in the Invitational tournament during the next two weeks.

The Seminoles open with a two game series against Georgia Tech Monday and Tuesday. Northeastern Louisiana State gets into the act Wednesday, then North Carolina, Mississippi State, Duke, Amherst, Wake Forest and Michigan State.

All Florida State games this week will be played at 3:30 on Seminole field.
