

Florida State yesterday staged its biggest batting display so far this season, beating North Carolina 17 - 3 for its tenth straight victory in the FSU Invitational Baseball Tournament.

Earlier yesterday, the Tar Heels, now 1-3, lost to Wake Forest 6-4.

Seminole batters got 21 hits. They zoomed off to a five-run lead in the first inning. The

first five men up scored, and the Seminoles batted around.

Gary Williamson, in his first pitching start of the year, was hampered a bit by wildness, and walked in two runs in the third. He balked a Carolina run in from third in the fourth.

FSU added three runs in the fifth, on doubles by Gary Nichols and Larry Johnson plus two throwing errors by catcher Merle Kruer. Singles by Mike Augustine, Nichols and Ken Suarez

added three more in the sixth.

Then came the big seventh inning.

Williamson opened with a single, it was followed by two quick outs. Monty McBryde got his third single in as many trips, Bob Wilcox singled, Nichols walked, Johnson and Suarez hit back-to-back doubles. When the smoke had cleared, six Seminole runs were across.

In addition to McBryde's perfect 3-for-3 day, Nichols had 3-

for-4, including two doubles. Suarez drove in three runs with two hits, Gerry Chmielewski had Johnson continued his hot work with the bat with three hits in four trips and three RBIs.

In a morning game Wake Forest's All-American trio of Wayne Martin, Billy Scripture, and Dave Miller did most of the

damage against Carolina.

Martin, a second - team All - America catcher, rapped a three - run double in the eighth inning after the Deacs had trailed 4-3. Martin's blast scored first - team All - America outfielder Scripture, third - teamer and second baseman Dave Miller, and Walt Noell, who had walked.

North Carolina scored three in the sixth. Bill Brown's single scored Bob Bonczek and Jim Speight, who had singled, after Dick Prindle, who walked, came home on Speight's hit.

Wake Forest got more in the fifth. Miller and Noell drew walks, and Scripture and left fielder Mike Budd followed with singles to bring them home.

Lefthander Louis Howard, workhorse of the Deacon staff, went the distance for the ACC title favorites. The Deacons are 5-0.

Only one game was scheduled today—FSU vs. Wake Forest at 3:30. Tomorrow Danny Litwhiler's Michigan State team takes on the Deacons at 11:30, then meets the Seminoles at 3:30.
