

Wake Forest's Jim Israel lifted a pitch over the left field fence in the eighth inning, giving the Deacons two runs for a 6-4 victory and stopping Florida State's win streak at ten games.

The score was tied 4-4 when left fielder Mike Budd opened the eighth with a sharp single off FSU starter Marty Howell. Then came Israel's homer. The Deacon first baseman had two strikeouts and a sacrifice bunt to his credit before the blow.

FSU and the Deacons had been locked in a tight game since the first inning, when All-American Bill Scripture doubled with two away, then came home on Budd's single.

Florida State countered with a run in the second when Ken Suarez walked, moved to second on Gerry Chmielewski's slow roller and scored on a wild throw by third baseman Danny Loftin. The Seminoles added another in the third on another error by Loftin and singles by Johnson and Suarez, scoring Bob Wilcox.

Budd opened the fourth with a base on balls, and FSU shortstop Johnson dropped Suarez's perfect peg on a steal attempt, whereupon Loftin lined a single to right, scoring Budd.

Both teams struck for two runs in the sixth. The Deacons got theirs on a walk to Budd, a sacrifice bunt by Israel, singles by Loftin and Don Metzger and another throwing error by Johnson.

Florida State scored on walks to Mike Augustine and Nichols, followed by a double by Gary Nichols and an ensuing error on the throw in by right fielder Metzger.

The Seminoles had runners on base in every inning, stranded a total of 15. Twice in early innings the bases were loaded, but no hits could be found.

For Wake Forest it was the

sixth win in as many starts, for FSU the third loss in 15 games.

Both teams take on Danny Litwhiler's undefeated Michigan State team today and tomorrow. Wake Forest plays MSU at 11:30 both days, and FSU follows at 3:30.

The Seminoles get two more shots at Wake Forest, the team they defeated in last year's District 3 NCAA playoffs in Gastonia, N. C.

They play Friday afternoon following an MSU - Wake Forest morning game, then meet in a single game Saturday at 1:30 p. m.
