

Florida State's Seminoles clubbed their way Saturday to a 9-2 victory over previously undefeated Wake Forest.

It was a satisfying day for FSU Coach Fred Hatfield who had seen his team drop two of its four season losses to the powerful Deacons this week.

Behind the lanky right arm of Cliff Ranew the Seminoles made it look easy yesterday. Ranew gave up only five hits in his fifth victory against no defeats this season, while his mates supplied 11 singles and two doubles off three Wake Forest pitchers.

The loser was Jerry Pardue, the lefthander who beat FSU, 6-4, here Tuesday. His day was due as the first four men to face him rapped out base hits and came on to score.

The story was much the same in the second inning, when the Seminoles got three runs on three hits, then coasted for their 15th victory of the season.

Reliever Frank Christie hit a lone homer off Ranew in the eighth inning to score one Deacon run. Jim Israel and Danny Loftin put together a double and single combination with two out to score the other in the sixth.

re Jim Reed led off for FSU in the first with a bunt single down the third baseline. Mike Augustine followed with a ripper down the first base line which Israel found for him. Then Monty McBryde faked a bunt and slapped the next pitch over the third baseman's head to score Reed.

Gary Nichols struck out and Bob Wilcox singled Reed home. Then second baseman Dave Miller made two errors on one play to allow two more FSU runners across. Shortstop Walter Noell fielded Larry Johnson's grounder cleanly and threw to second in a force attempt on Wilcox. Miller dropped the ball then threw wide to third trying to catch McBryde.

A similar script was used in the second. Reed led off with a solid single. He was followed by Augustine who responded likewise. McBryde beat out a beautiful bunt and the bases were loaded. Wilcox walked to bring in one run and long flies by Nichols and Johnson scored the other two.

The Seminoles struck again in the fifth, when Ken Suarez drew a walk, Chmielewski doubled, and Ranew singled sharply, scoring both.

Yesterday marked the end of the Florida State Invitational tournament in which Florida State won 13 against eight teams from all parts of the country. The only two losses were to Wake Forest.

Florida State is idle until the 20th when the Seminoles head out on their first road trip of the season, meeting Auburn, Georgia Tech, Georgia and Georgia Southern before returning home for a two game series with Miami on the 27th and 28th.
