

ATLANTA, Ga. — Florida State's baseball Seminoles snapped out of their post-exam lethargy and resumed their winning ways by pasting a 14-1 licking on Georgia Tech here yesterday.

The Seminoles dropped a 5-3 decision to Auburn, Monday, but Tech's Yellow Jackets found Cliff Ranew's lanky right arm too much for them, while FSU hitters had a field day, getting to three Jacket pitchers for 13 hits.

Ranew looked like an undefeated pitcher should in his sixth victory of the season. Tech managed three of its five hits in the first three innings, but couldn't scratch again until the

ninth. The Engineers' one run came in the ninth and was unearned.

Ranew, who seems bent on rewriting Seminole record books in his first year at FSU, struck out seven and hit a triple to aid his cause.

Right fielder Bob Wilcox delivered the most telling blow in a big nine-run fourth inning. His line shot over second base cleared the center fielder's head on the first hop and Wilcox had an inside the park homer, driving in three runs.

The big cleanup hitter also hammered out a double and a single in four trips, driving in a total of five runs, biggest single output for the Seminoles this year.

Ken Suarez hit his third solo

roundtripper of the season in the fifth, and he and shortstop Larry Johnson got in some good licks in the big fourth. Both had two RBIs.

Fred Hatfield emptied the bench as his Seminoles coast-

ed to their 16th victory of the year and their third straight over the Yellow Jackets.

Bill Bearse slammed out a triple in the eighth. Reserves Tom Thomas, Randy Brown and Dave Dahlen also found Jacket pitching to their liking, getting a hit apiece in one time at bat.

"The team seems to have gotten back in the groove," said Hatfield. "There was a lot of spirit and their play was sharp."

The Seminoles continue their road schedule in Athens, Ga., today and tomorrow, meeting Georgia's Bulldogs.

Monroe Hunt was scheduled to pitch this afternoon. He has won two, lost none this year.
