

Cliff Ranew, his long right arm cracking like a bullwhip, mastered Kentucky for six soggy innings yesterday, and enough offensive power was generated to give Florida State a rain-shortened 2-0 victory over the Wildcats.

Back-to-back doubles by Monty McBryde and Moose Hopkins in the first, and a long-gone, 411-foot home run by Dick Fernandez in the third gave Ranew all the runs needed for his second victory of the season.

A senior from Albany, Ga., Ranew, had a tough act to follow. The first ball of the afternoon — and FSU's home season — was thrown by Governor Haydon Burns, who pitched a fastball which doesn't appear in the box score.

The batter was Dr. Carl Pittner, FSU's vice president in charge of economic affairs. Acting President John E. Champ...

It bounced off the left-center field fence some 300 feet from home plate, and McBryde scored from second.

Fernandez led off the third inning, swinging from somewhere in back of the grandstand. His drive cleared the centerfield fence just to the left of the flagpole and goes down as one of the longest ever hit at Seminole Field.

Raney, who compiled a record of 7-2 for the Seminoles last season, never looked better. The 35-footer sent his hard one singing through the constant drizzle, and his curve kept the Wilcox batters off balance. He struck out five, gave no bases on balls and allowed only three harmless singles.

The victory brought the Seminoles' record to 4-1, the only

blemish being a 3-0 tie with 25-ers in a game called because of darkness.

Next action for Florida State is next Friday when the Seminoles meet the U. S. Naval Academy in Jacksonville.

Next Saturday, the Seminoles will meet the Baltimore Colts farm club at Seminole Field in conjunction with a youth clinic to be staged jointly by Florida State and professional players.
