

Marvin Stringfellow, a baby-faced Florida State sophomore with an educated left arm, tied Duke in knots while his teammates unravelled two Blue Devil pitchers for 15 hits to win their second game of the FSU Invitational 11-1 here yesterday.

The Seminole slugfest came at the end of a long day's action which saw Michigan State down Wake Forest 2-0 in 13 innings, and Wake Forest bounce back to defeat Duke 3-1.

The FSU victory left Florida State as the tournament's only undefeated team, and Duke as the only winless one.

Stringfellow, an outstanding pitcher on last year's freshmen team, made his first appearance before the home fans a memorable one.

He allowed only eight runners to reach first base during the game, and seemed assured of a shutout until the eighth inning when a leadoff single by Tom Coble, a throwing error by left-fielder Roy Mewbourne, and another single by Jim Barretti got the Devils their only score of the afternoon.

A sixth-inning explosion in the lower half of the FSU batting order broke open a close game and the Seminoles went on to make a rout of it.

FSU was better than Duke's hander, Jim Barretti, who had managed only two hits in the first five innings. Monty McBryde scored in the second on a walk, stolen base and a fluke triple by Gary Lawrence.

The Seminoles waited until two were out in the sixth before Randy Brown and McBryde came on with back-to-back singles — the first good shots of the afternoon.

After Lawrence walked, Stringfellow earned his place in the batting order with a well-hit single, scoring two runs. Dick Fernandez finished the scoring with a two-run single of his own.

In the seventh, Mike Martin singled and stole second. Pete Sarrea flied out to right, but Tom Thomas swung from the south side and lifted one over the tall pines next to the right field scoreboard.

Brown went out unassisted to first, but McBryde kept things alive with his second hit of the day. Then Gerry Chastekowski got his first hit of the season — a towering drive over the left field fence.

Back - to - back doubles by Brown and Rick Hutchinson and a single by Mewbourne finished the scoring.

Stringfellow went the distance for FSU, striking out seven and giving up no bases on balls.

Michigan State and Duke were scheduled to meet at 12:30 today, followed by FSU vs. Wake Forest at 3.
