Tribe Wins, Shifts Made

WHITING FIELD—Florida State's baseball team returns here to Seminole Field Friday... with a new look. Coach Fred Hatfield's charges won their last four games, but with different personnel doing business at the old stand.

Seminoles finished an eight game road trip with a seven inning, 12-3 victory over Pensacola Navy here Saturday. John McCune started and won his first game of the year. Dick Fernandez, Pete Sarron, Wayne Giardino and Joe McKinney each drove in two runs for the Seminoles. McKinney's came on a homer with one aboard in the sixth.

Coach Fred Hatfield intended to use the two games with Pensacola Navy for experimentation in order to bolster a lineup crippled by injuries on the recent Seminole swing through the Carolinas.

Centerfielder Mike Martin is definitely out for the remainder of the season with a broken arm, and the jury is still out on Bob Wilcox who is suffering from a shoulder injury. Gerry Chmielewski and Tom Thomas have minor leg ailments.

If the Seminoles came home tomorrow it's likely that only second baseman Fernandez and catcher Randy Brown would be in the same positions in which they started the season.

The addition of Wayne Giardino at shortstop sent Maury Hopkins to third, first and occasionally the outfield. The team's leading home run hitter and one of its more versatile members afield, the ex-Manatee star looks like the starting first baseman at this point.

With Hopkins on first, Sarron moves into the outfield to strengthen matters there. He'll play either left or right with Thomas or Monty McBryde down the other foul line.

Centerfield remains a question mark. If Wilcox recovers, his bat could win him the spot. Otherwise, sophomore Roy Mewbourne is hitting and fielding consistently.

Giardino still needs work before he can move in as the regular shortstop, according to Hatfield. If he fails to rebound into shape by Friday, Gary Lawrence will probably start.

This leaves third base open to Chmielewski and McKinney.

Hatfield also wanted to find out about some pitchers who

have seen limited action this season. He got eight good innings out of soph Steve Marks Friday, and went with three pitchers yesterday, getting good performances from Ken Creeley and Bob Kull in addition to McCune.

The Seminoles are now 19-6-1. They open a home stand against Loyola of New Orleans Friday.
