Georgia Southern tied the game at 3-all in the third as Hawkins walked Larry Groce and pinch - hitter Scotty Carpenter. The only Seminole error of the day—a bobbled bunt by third baseman Wayne Giardino—loaded the bases.

Second baseman Jackie Hammond boomed a sacrifice fly to right, scoring Groce, Carpenter scored on a dribbler to the right side, and right fielder Bobby Butler hit a clean single to bring in Royce Exley, the bunter.

Three straight singles in the seventh added another Eagle run before a Hopkins to Fernandez to Nichols double play choked off the rally. It was one of two double plays started by Hopkins. He and Nichols combined for another in the eighth.

Nichols had an unassisted double play in the first when he grabbed Hammond's liner and doubled Exley off first.

The victory brings the Seminole record to 22-5. Georgia Southern is 19-6.

The two teams meet again today at 3 p. m.
