

Catcher Randy Brown boomed two home runs high over the right field fence to lead Florida State in a 6-2 victory over Georgia Southern here yesterday.

Brown's homers came with one aboard in both the first and fifth innings.

He hit a line-drive single and walked in his other two trips to the plate, scored three runs while driving in four.

The home runs were the FSU catcher's fifth and six of the year.

The Seminoles got their six runs on ten hits, six of which went for extra bases. Cliff Rasmussen went the route to win his seventh of the year against two bases.

Florida State's record is now 28-6. The Seminoles play Jacksonville University here tomorrow afternoon.

While FSU sluggers chased Eagle starter Jerry Stephens off the mound in the first inning, Dick Fernandez led off and filed out, backing the right fielder against the fence.

Maury Hookins followed with a deep triple to center and came home on a double to right center by Tom Thomas.

Brown hit his first one into the pine trees in right center, chasing Thomas home ahead of him. Gary Nichols followed with a long double, but Stephens gave way to Bob Pierce who retired the side.

Southern picked up a run in

the second when Jim Seeley walked and went to second on a wild pitch. Tribe third baseman Wayne Giardino erted on Bobby Butler's grounder.

With runners on first and second Fernandez went for two on Stan Sumner's grounder to the right side. His throw was not in time to catch Butler going to second and all hands were safe.

Seeley scored on a sacrifice fly by Leshman Stanley.

Florida State picked another run in the third, Brown singled with two outs and Nichols slammed his second double of the day to bring him home.

Thomas walked with one out in the fifth and Brown towered one over the pines down the right field line.

Southern's other run came in the top of the fifth when Tommy Jones doubled. He went to third on a error by Fernandez and came home as the Seminoles rattled off a Hopkins-Fernandez-Nichols double play.
