

Florida State's baseball team pushed its record to 14-3-1 here yesterday, and started a mildly anxious wait for a telephone call.

The Seminoles topped Jacksonville U. here 2-2. They aren't scheduled to play again until next Friday, at Florida.

Meanwhile, during that idle span, an invitation to an at-large team for the District 3 playoffs in Gastonia, N. C., is expected to be issued.

Florida State figures as the

leading candidate for the bid, but the Seminoles can be assured of nothing until they get that phone call. Best guess is that the bid will go out on Tuesday or Wednesday.

Second baseman Dick Fernandez' hot bat contributed big to yesterday's triumph.

Fernandez, who had a 12-game hitting streak broken against Georgia Southern this week, rapped a triple and two singles, driving in two runs and scoring two more.

The Tampa junior got both his RBIs in the fourth on an "almost home run" to right center. The drive hit the top railing of the fence, then bounced back over the heads of the Jacksonville outfielders. Fernandez chased Gary Nichols and Steve Marks home as he went into third standing up.

On a comparatively light day at the plate for the nationally sixth-ranked Seminoles, Gary Lawrence was the only other to get more than one hit. The third baseman drove in two runs with singles in the second and seventh innings.

Marks, a sophomore right-hander, spaced six hits and struck out six, winning his third game of the year against no defeats.

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He walked only two. These came in the fifth inning after Jacksonville catcher Charles Abbott opened with a single. Ron Clark and Neal Kapp drew the walks to load the bases.

Lawrence started a double play on Joe Schlegal's grounder and Abbott scored from third. Losing pitcher John Moraski looped a little fly over second. Roy Mewbourne attempted a diving catch in centerfield, but the ball rolled through for a double, scoring Kapp from third.

Jacksonville posed no other threats during the game, and made five errors, giving the Seminoles five unearned runs.
