

A lightning shot off the bat of Dick Fernandez brought home the winning run in the tenth inning yesterday as Florida State dropped Ole Miss 8-8, in a pressure-packed charge from behind. The Seminoles once trailed by six, at 7-1.

Jim Lytle's looping double, after two outs, cleaned the loaded bases in the bottom of the ninth to tie the game, the Seminoles were counted down and out by most of the 1200 fans. Ole Miss led all the way until then, and easily could have won but for 13 bases on balls given up by four pitchers.

Florida State had slightly better luck with six pitchers, but old faithful Marvin Stringfellow had to strike out the side in the tenth to keep the Seminoles alive.

Rebel Chet Bergalewski put FSU in the hole from the start with a grand-slam home run in the first inning. Two walks and a single off FSU starter Chuck Hawkins had loaded the bases.

The Seminoles countered with a run in the first when Gary Sprague led off with a walk, moved to third on Lytle's wind-blown double to left and came home when Bergalewski let a peg from right get by him after Randy Brown's fly.

FSU's seemingly endless well of base hits dried up and Rebel righthander Russ Johnson experienced no problems with the Seminoles until the sixth.

Ole Miss fattened its lead by three runs in the top of the sixth. Bergalewski singled, and first sacker Buzzy Haven was hit by a pitch — the first of four Rebel batters who gained first base by this means. Second baseman Tommy Morris hit a ringing triple, then came home on a sacrifice fly by Dave Jennings.

The Seminoles also counted three in the sixth. Walks to Maury Hopkins and Mike Martin paved a 2-run Fernandez triple to deep center. Fernandez scored on Sprague's grounder to first.

Sophomore Jim Matbers, the third Seminole pitcher, had trouble in the ninth. He hit the first batter to face him, got the next two on a sacrifice bunt and a grounder to third, then walked one and hit another to load the bases. Relfefer Marty Brooks hit Bergalewski to force in a run, making the score 8-4, Ole Miss.

Chuck Huffstatter had relieved Johnson in the eighth when the Seminoles loaded the bases, but failed to score. Huffstatter got Hopkins on strikes to open the ninth, but gave up successive bases on balls to Pete Sarron, Martin and Fernandez. Sarron scampered home on a passed ball, but Stringfellow popped up in a pinch - at bat.

However, Sprague drew a base on balls and Lytle hit a high fly which fell in for a double in mid-left field, scoring three runners.

In the top half of the tenth Stringfellow struck out the first man he faced him, then a two-base throwing error by Hopkins put Sarron on second, where he scored on Stringfellow's second out down the line. The Seminoles won the game.

to open the bottom of the second on Sarron's attempted sacrifice. Martin singled Sarron to third, and then came Fernandez.

He took the first pitch for a strike, then rifled one directly at third baseman Jennings, who found the shot much too hot to handle.
