

Back-to-back home runs by Jim Lyttle and Randy Brown got Florida State's baseball team off and running toward a 9-4 victory over Ole Miss here yesterday.

Lyttle's blow drove in Gary Sprague, who had walked. The Seminoles were trailing, 1-0 at the time, but never fell behind again.

First baseman Glen Lusk put the Rebels on the scoreboard with a solo homer in the first. Ole Miss catcher Chet Bergalowski hit his second round-tripper in as many days in the third.

Steve Marks started for the Seminoles and got credit for the victory. Eddie Howell came on in relief in the sixth and turned in an outstanding performance, giving up only two hits and striking out four.

With the Seminoles ahead by two, the teams traded runs for three innings before three Mississippi errors allowed FSU to tie the game with three runs in the seventh.

Ole Miss had full sacks in the second, but could manage only one run. After Mickey Williams flied to center, three successive singles through the box came from the bats of Tommy Morris, Dave Jennings and pitcher Eric Ayer. A tremendous throw by FSU centerfielder Mike Martin held Morris at third following

Ayer's hit, but Marks walked Charlie Williams to force in the one run.

Jennings was forced at home on Eddie Brawley's grounder to third, and Williams was forced at second on a grounder to short, to get Marks out of the inning with as little damage as possible.

FSU's run in the second came on a walk to Tom Thomas, a sacrifice by Marks and a single by Gary Lawrence.

Bergalowski homered for Ole Miss in the third, then FSU scored on singles by Lyttie, Brown and Dick Fernandez. Both teams were scoreless in the fourth.

The Rebels made their last bid in the fifth when Lusk walked to open the inning then scored on singles by Yawn and Mickey Williams. A double play, started by Maury Hopkins from first base, got the Seminoles out of trouble.

—Martin was hit by a pitch to open the FSU end of the fifth. Ayer tried to pick him off first but the throw got by Lusk and Martin came all the way home.

The Mississippi infield committed three errors to go with a single by Hopkins and a double by Martin to give the Seminoles three additional runs in the seventh.

Lyttle's home run was his fifth of the year, two of which have been inside the park.

Florida State was scheduled to play Ole Miss again today at 3, again tomorrow at 1:30.
