

Florida State, after spotting Mississippi nine runs in the first two innings exploded for a 10-run fifth frame and went on to defeat the Rebels 11-10 yesterday at Seminole Field.

The Seminole rally came after Ole Miss starter Charles Owen had handcuffed the Tribe on four hits in the early going. Nine of FSU's runs came after two men were out and all were unearned.

Pinch-hitter Bob Canty started the Seminole fifth with a double. Gary Sprague, the Seminole shortstop, walked to put two runners on, but right-fielder Jim Lytle flied out to center field.

Randy Brown was safe on a fielder's choice, and went to second when Ole Miss first baseman Glen Lusk's throw went into leftfield. All hands were safe and Canty scored on the play.

Tom Thomas singled to load the bases and after Maury Hopkins struck out, Pete Saron walked, forcing in a run.

Mike Martin followed with a double to left that cleared the bases and Dick Fernandez's single scored Martin from second with the Tribe's sixth run.

Kenny Ryland came in to relieve Owen, but the Seminole bats kept right on pounding.

Canty was the first man to face Ryland and he drew a pass. Sprague followed with a double scoring Fernandez and moving Canty to third.

Lytle produced the equalizer with a single to right scoring both runners, and took second when Rebel rightfielder Eddie Deuschle dropped the ball.

Brown singled to score Lytle with the final tally of the uprising.

Ole Miss had jumped to a nine to nothing lead in the first two innings with the aid of four first-inning errors by the Seminoles.

Deuschle singled to open the game and was safe at second when Charlie Williams grounded to Fernandez and his throw pulled Sprague off the bag at second.

Lusk followed with a single scoring Deuschle, and Williams stopped at third. Chet Bergalowski sent another grounder to second, but Fernandez' toss to second was in the dirt and Williams scored.

Jimmy Yawn, the Mississippi shortstop, dribbled a single under Fernandez's glove, and when Martin bobbled the ball in center Lusk scored.

Three more singles and a fielder's choice rounded out the six run first for the Rebels.

In the second Ole Miss used a walk, a double by Lusk, a triple by Yawn, and a single by Ronnie Robinson to tally three more runs, before Pic Hearn replaced Seminole starter Jim Ward.

The Tribe scored what turned out to be the winning run in the sixth on a single by Martin, a stolen base, a wild pitch, and another single by Marv Stringfellow, the third Seminole hurler.

Hearn was given credit for the win, while Ryland picked up the loss.

Florida State plays Mississippi again today at 1:30 p.m. following the Little League Clinic at 10 a.m.
