Florida State primed its big guns behind the shutout pitching of sophomore Jim Helm and defeated Spring Hill, 13-0, for the 17th Seminole victory of the season here yesterday.

With 16 hits, including home runs by Pete Sarron, Jim Lyttle and Maury Hopkins, the Seminoles had another field day at the plate at the expense of the Mobile, Ala. school.

Helm gave way to fellow soph Jim Mathers in the ninth, but the lanky righthander from Louisville, Ky. needed no assistance. He fanned ten batters during his eight inning stint, and gave up only four scattered singles. He struck out the side in the third and fifth innings, and Mathers followed suit in the ninth after giving up a double to Spring Hill first baseman Woody Perkins.

The game was a scoreless tie until the fourth inning, when Gary Lawrence drove in Pete Sarron with the first Seminole run. FSU went on to get three in the fourth and scored in each inning thereafter until the eighth.

Sarron had three singles in addition to his home run. He was hit by a pitch on one trip to the plate and finished with a perfect 4 for 4 day.

Hopkins drove in three runs with his homer and hit a double in the sixth for another RBI.

Lyttle's homer was his eighth of the year, tying a school record set last year by Hopkins. Hopkins and Sarron each have four.

Another big stick for the Seminoles was second baseman Dick Fernandez who had three hits, including a double and a triple.

Florida State's record is now 17-5. The Seminoles meet North Carolina here tomorrow afternoon at 3.
