thern 9-4 and 9-1 setbacks earlier this season in Statesboro, and had shutout the Eagles 10-0 Monday.

The coolish temperatures showed its effect on both teams' pitchers, as each club struck for 11 hits in the wide open game. Eight stolen bases aided the Tribe's cause.

FSU jumped to an early 2-0 lead with single runs in the first two innings.

In the opening frame Gary Sprague greeted Southern hurler, Jimmy Dobson with a leadoff double. After Jim Lyttle flied to left, Randy Brown drove a triple to right sending Sprague home.

With one out in the second inning Mike Martin drew a base on balls, and after be stole second base, Dick Fernandez singled to center driving him in.

Southern came back with four runs in the third inning bowever, which was enough

to send FSU starter Marty Brooks to the showers.

Two singles and a walk loaded the bases for the Eagles with no outs, and when third baseman Jackie Hammond grounded into a force play at second, Ralph Lynch scampered across with the Georgian's first run.

A single to right by Leah-

man Stanley sent Dobson
home, and an error by Seminole third sacker Maury Hopkins allowed the third run to
score. Another single by Tim

and Eddie Howell came in to

Southern added another run in the fourth to increase its lead to 5-2 before FSU countered with three runs to knot things up in the home half.
