Jim Lyttle cracked his 11th home run of the year and Eddle Howell hurled a two-hitter as Florida State downed the Florida Gators 4-0, in the first game of a double header for its sixth straight victory.

The second game was rained out with the Seminoles leading 2-0, in the fifth inning. The Seminoles, now 34-10, have won 13 out of their last 14 games. The Gators are now 21-11.

The victory gave the Seminoles the scholarship offered by the West St. Petersburg Exchange Club to the school winning the most athletic contests. The Tribe holds a 8-6-2 margin over the Gators including three baseball games, two swimming matches, two tennis matches and a cross country meet.

Howell went the distance for the Tribe in copping his sixth victory against two defeats. The senior lefthander struck out five and walked three in the seven inning contest. Losing pitcher Ray Rollyson also went the route. He gave up seven hits in taking his fifth loss of the year in ten decisions. He struck out four and did not walk any. The Seminoles got to work right away against Rollyson. Shortstop Gary Sprague led off the bottom half of the first with a single. Lyttle followed with his home run, first in a month for the Seminole slugger, a 400-foot blast to left center.

Tommy Thomas followed with a single and after, Pete Sarron struck out, Mike Martin singled Thomas to second. Rollyson bore down and forced Chico Fernandez to pop up and Gary Lawrence to strike out.

The Tribe got the final two runs in the fifth inning. Pitcher Howell and Sprague led off the frame with singles. Lyttle forced Sprague at second with Howell, taking third.

Thomas lined a single to left scoring Howell. Lyttle scored as Sarron grounded into a force out and Lyttle scored as Gator second basemen Bruce Moore threw wild-

ly to first on an attempted double play.

The Gators made only two serious threats against Howell, but fine defensive work by

outfielders Martin and Lyttle saved the day.

Moore led off the Gator first with a line single to center. It would have been at least a double, but he fell on the slippery turf and was forced to go back to first. Shortstop Don Pendley hit a grounder to Sarron at first base, whose throw to second was wild and both runners were safe.

Don Cushman forced Pendley at second with Moore going to third. Jim Frazier lined a long fly ball to Martin in deep center. His throw to the plate was right on target to double up Moore, who attempted to score on the play. Bill Blomgren opened the Gator fifth by reaching first on an error by Sarron. He was forced by Jack Kenworthy. Pitcher Rollyson lined a double to deep center, with Kenworthy stopping at third.

Howell forced Moore to foul out to Sarron, and Pendley flied out to Lyttle in deep right field against the fence. The Seminoles wasted a home run by catcher Ed Yarnell and a fine pitching effort by Mary Stringfellow in the second game.

The rain started falling in the fourth inning with the Seminoles ahead 1-0. The game continued, with Yarnell hitting his homer in the fourth.

Catcher Ed Gross led off the fifth with a booming double for the Gators. Right fielder Jack Withrow was walked, to give the Gators men on first and second with no outs. At this point the rain came down harder and úmpire Phil Shaw officially called the game.

The Tribe will close out its regular season with single games against Clemson Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday afternoons.
